## You are coming... Aren't you?

How many times have you heard that in your life? I hear it from Sandy all the time. Only this time I am asking you, and it is about the NED Leadership School on January 5th in Fitchburg, just like last year. Except... it will not be exactly like last year. We have introduced some new ideas in both sections, COTS and NEDed classes.

To start with, Mr. President, this will be a day like no other you have ever experienced in one of these schools. You will be providing most of the input, answering most of the questions, deciding what topics will be covered. The emphasis in the President's class, with Alan Lamson, will be on chapter planning, and the final two hours of the day will give you the opportunity to sit with the men from your chapter to begin, or continue, the planning for 2008 for your chapter. Watch for an email that will give you more insight on this class.

A second innovation will be the Keene, NH chapter leading the day-long class on Membership recruiting and retention. They have been very successful over the past five years, and they want to share their concepts with you. Everyone in your chapter who is interested in building up your membership should spend some time with the Keene Cheshiremen on the 5th.

Our own Steve Tramack will be facilitating the class for Directors with a wealth of information available. Chuck Alexander, from Ontario District, will be leading the Music and Performance VP class. Chuck Eaker will be conducting a CDWI class for five front-line directors. Todd Lamson will again hold a Directors of the future class for beginning directors and section leaders. That should give all our chapters a good dose of musical training for the day.

We have Raymond Schwarzkopf coming in from Ontario to give us the benefit of his experience with Youth in Harmony programs. He offers many ideas on how to get started, what to do if you already have a program in place to add to that, and much more.

Of course we did not forget the Secretaries and Treasurers. The latest news and materials from the Society will be presented and discussed by Walt Lane and Dan Robillard. Those attending these two classes should come prepared with lots of questions to get your answers first-hand.

The NEDed side of the school will offer nearly a dozen classes. Some repeats from last year include classes on Section Leaders, Chapter Newsletters, and Show Chairmen. New

Classes include a Standing Ovation Reviewers Training Class, NED marketing, Fund-Raising, Hosting VIP's, and Leadership. We have several others not quite finalized.

## Calling All Chapter Treasurers

You are not the chapter bookkeeper or bean-counter, you are a treasurer with information necessary for your chapter executive board to rely on for financial stability, chapter growth and chapter direction. You do not need to be an Accountant or CPA to be a chapter treasurer. All you need is this course. Come to the Treasurers Course this year and you will be given instruction on how to be a GREAT treasurer that will improve your chapter standing in the community and with its members. Starting this year, there are new IRS requirements for all US Chapters that you will need to be aware of to comply with and maintain your chapters "Not-for-Profit" status. This course is open to all chapter treasurers renewing and new incoming.

Your instructor, Dan Robillard, has been the NED District Treasurer for the last 5 years. He has experience with small and large chapters and understands the unique needs of both kinds and everything in between. He has developed the training information for the Society for using Quicken in the chapter treasurer position. This material is now a standard part of the COTS curriculum with in the Society.

These documents will not be available for handouts. Then print and read or be familiar with the material within. It will help the class run smoother and more essential materials can be covered in the short period of time we will have.

Finally, at about 3:00 PM, you will be given time to begin, or continue, that chapter planning process for 2008. You will meet with as many of your chapter officers as you have brought with you, plus any other men from your chapter that you invite to share the planning process. The instructors for the day will be available during the next two hours to consult with you, if you ask them, to kick-start your 2008 programs.

It is our goal to have you leave the NED Leadership School with a few new ideas on how you plan to function as the president of your chapter. We hope your Board members will have the same experience from their classes. We hope we will have given your chapter leadership some new tools to use to make your chapter even better than it already is. That should give your members even more reason to show up on meeting night, to have even more fun singing there, and to receive even more enjoyment from belonging to this wonderful hobby we share.....barbershopping.

## More Than A New Year 'Chapter' Resolution...

### *Chapters Must Incorporate - It's The Law!*

Happy holidays to all - and welcome to the New Year! What a great time to review your organizational structure and implement strategies for success in 2008!

The Society requires that all chapters be incorporated as not-for-profit corporations. The Internal Revenue Service has determined that the Society and its chapters, as educational and charitable non-profit corporations are exempt from federal income tax as organizations described in section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Incorporation generally protects the chapter members from claims made against the chapter for damages, injuries or debts for which the chapter might be liable. To be chartered by the Society, a chapter must be incorporated in its state or province.

A chapter that is not incorporated technically is not in compliance with the Society Bylaws, Statements of Policy, rules and regulations, and not eligible to compete, have a vote in the House of Delegates meeting in its district, register quartets as part of its chapter (which will affect their ability to compete, too) or be covered under any of the Society's liability insurance coverage.

Most states/provinces require that corporations annually file a statement of continued existence or annual report, in order to remain in good corporate standing in the state/province. Failure to provide that required proof would lead to cause for suspension of the chapter and could lead to charter revocation by the Society. During the suspension period, current Society regulations require that all members of a suspended chapter not receive their Harmonizers, the chapter chorus cannot compete and the chapter loses its vote in the House of Delegates meeting.

Back in 2001, when we were putting together the first Harmony College Northeast, we were troubled by our inability to make contact with Joe Barbershopper on a timely basis. The only avenue we had was the Nor'easter and it only came out 3 or 4 times a year. Our plans were changing constantly - with the new courses we would be offering and the International quartets who were agreeing to attend - that we wanted you guys to hear the news as quickly as possible. Deadlines in February for an April edition and May for a July edition of the Nor'easter weren't going to do it.

Fortunately for us, the Internet was beginning to boom with new ways to communicate arriving almost every day. Because we had some computer-savvy men who would help, we found Yahoo! and thus NED Division egroups were born.

Most of you know how we have used the groups, first to bring you news about HCNE and, subsequently, to deliver information about contests and conventions, other schools, shows, and inter-chapter events like the Beverly Bash or the National Anthem Sing for the Pawtucket Red Sox. We made sure all the messages were run through a filter (a Moderator) so you wouldn't have to listen to gossip - and we make certain the messages stay on point, i.e. district, division, and chapter business.

As is always the case, these Yahoo! groups don't run themselves. There are constant changes in email addresses that need to be updated and new members to be added. In the past, we've relied on the membership lists at Society headquarters (anyone else having trouble saying Nashville after all those years saying Kenosha?)

We'll be happy to wait for that information to flow down to us from Nashville, but ... we also know that every chapter has its own email list that is used for internal communication of all kinds. Your chapter email list is the most up-to-date list, being constantly monitored and updated. Someone in your chapter is in charge of that list. Perhaps it is the Chapter Secretary... or Chorus Manager... or Chapter Development guy. It would be really helpful to us in keeping the Yahoo groups updated if that someone would send your chapter's

most recent and accurate email address list to us. We will use the list immediately to confirm that every man in your chapter is in the Yahoo groups with a current, correct email address. This will ensure that every NED member with an email address is getting information about all things barbershop as it develops in the NED.

Please send the list to: [jamesdodge@comcast.net](mailto:jamesdodge@comcast.net) . I will simply verify or update the NED Divisional Yahoo! Group with the email address for each of your chapter members.

Some members may have concerns about privacy issues when you are added to the list. First, you will not receive any other email from this group other than NED business. Second, your email address is private and will not be used in any other way. And, you have our assurance that no one needs to stay in the groups if they don't want to. Every message from the NED Division Group has a link to "unsubscribe" or make changes in delivery. But we hope you will remain a NED Division Yahoo! Group subscriber - it's the best way to get timely news and information electronically!

Once again, our sincere thanks for your understanding, support and assistance on this project. The NED motto for this year was "Let your voices be heard!" This is one of the ways to do that!
