

Letter from the President

Our spring convention season is rapidly approaching. Both our Eastern and Western Regionals are open for convention registration and contestant entry now. Please help our fine Contest and Judging Committee and do not wait until the last minute to enter any of our contests to be held during these conventions.

Just a reminder, we'll be convening in Worcester, MA the weekend of April 17-19 and in Lake George, NY, the weekend of May 1-2. In a first for the NED, both conventions will have International Quartet Preliminary





Once again, our Western Regional convention will feature a big Saturday Night Quartet Finals along with a show featuring our current International Champion Quartet **Signature** and the two-time World Mixed Harmony Quartet Champion, **Double Date**. There might also be some additional surprise quartets who will appear on the show. I hope you will all join us, either in Lake George or in Worcester for a great weekend of barbershopping.

Just as a matter of note, since our Fall Convention is being held in Saint John, New Brunswick this October, our Sunrise Divisions brothers will not be holding their usual Spring Convention. Instead, they will be having their Division Convention and Contest along with the rest of the NED in Saint John. The convention committee is working to ensure that this will be very special District Convention, featuring some traditional activities that have been a part of past Sunrise Division Conventions. You'll be hearing a lot more about our District Convention as plans



are being finalized. Now is the time to mark your calendars and to prepare to attend. The dates are October 22-25, 2020, and believe me, you'll want to arrive in time for Thursday, Oct 22 events! Plan to make it a Fall mini vacation! There will be lots to see and do in Saint John!

Travel to Saint John, New Brunswick - Fall 2020

For everyone in the United States planning to travel to Saint John, New Brunswick, Canada for the Fall District Convention - and travelling BY CAR - the NED is simply recommending that each person crossing the border have a valid, current, United States Passport - and - one that is NOT expiring within the next six (6) months of/after October 2020 (e.g. not before April 2021). Contrary to any past statements, please note that a valid, state-issued (new) "REAL-ID" driver's license is NOT adequate for border-crossing, travel to/from Canada.

If you wish to pursue any of these acceptable means, you should do so, soon! After an application is submitted, a U.S. Passport can take 6-10 weeks to acquire, and maybe nearly the same amount of time for an unexpired renewal. A birth certificate and driver's license is no longer an acceptable means of ID/proof at the borders. If you are planning to fly, a U.S. Passport is your only acceptable form of proof. Air travel & TSA requires U.S. Passports, of course.

If you have a U.S. Passport now and it is not expiring before April 2021, you're all set! If yours is expiring between now and April 2021, we recommend renewing it now. If you need a U.S. Passport, why wait? Now is the best time to acquire yours if you want to be sure your border crossings are fast and easy. A U.S. Passport is quite valuable to have, overall, even for domestic travel. Again, don't wait until the last minute! No surprises at the border is best.

First, let me give you a bit of history. An idea was floated and promoted, at a time when the **Alton Bay Jamboree** had ceased operation, along with the hugely popular **Bolton Landing** event, by long time barbershopper *Ray Miller*, now of Paris, Maine. He saw the need to fill a void and convinced me into hosting the "Beachway Barbershop Bash". This was around 1997 here on Cape Cod. I believe he expected the event to snowball into a large annual and popular event such as Alton Bay had become many decades ago.

Unfortunately, the event did not generate a great deal of enthusiasm from NED members over the years and was discontinued after 2018. A few folks have expressed disappointment over the loss of this event, but the greatest outcry was from diehard members of the **Mid-Atlantic District** who are now lobbying to have it resume! If there appears to be enough demand from the barbershop community, it can happen. Quartets are needed to put a "favorable voice" out to the public that NED barbershopping is alive, well, and strong! In the meantime, I welcome YOUR feedback, support and whatever interest there may be to resurrect this Cape Cod event. Please!

We got this great news from Terry Bradway! (She's a SAI member with the Saratoga Soundtrack Chorus, a BHS member, a music teacher and the wife of Jeff Bradway of the Saratoga Springs chapter). She and her students have been great supporters the HXNE Camps. I'll let her tell the district, in her own words, on a great accomplishment. Her story is truly inspiring and shows just what kind of impact our music can have.



I'm actually the band director in my school (Watervliet High School, NY) - but started a barbershop group several years ago when we didn't have a voice music teacher. We meet after school once a week and almost all the students are from the band program. Since attending BHS Harmony University, it has been a goal of mine to bring a youth group to Midwinter. I wasn't sure of several "qualifying" issues, like, if our level of singing was high-enough, or if our size was too small (currently 15) compared to Debbie Cleveland's chorus, or if we could afford



going. We are a small city school with 87% free and reduced lunch. However, when I saw that 2021 Midwinter would be in New York City... why not try! We sent in an audition tape to BHS and we received word last week that we are one of the 20 youth groups selected!

I just wanted to let you know that reflecting on the journey, to get to this point, Harmony University and bringing my kids to NED HX camp, has made a huge difference to my program. Because we are small, NED HX camp gives these kids an opportunity to learn and sing in a larger ensemble and feel the energy of singing around them. Also, seeing and hearing the quartets on the Saturday night show has made a big impact.

Now the real work begins - planning and preparing the kids to meet their potential so that we can represent ourselves in the best way. To say we are excited is definitely an understatement.
